## The Feast of St. John: September 11

On Sunday, September 11, we will commemorate St. John, our patron saint, with special readings, prayers and music during our services, which will take place at 8am, 9am, 11:15am and 5:30pm. During the 9:00 and 11:15am services, the choir will sing Haydn's *Missa Brevis St. Joannis de Deo* (St. John of God) and the Eucharistic prayer will be sung. Incense will be used during the 11:15am service. Our Prayers of the People will be for our nation and the world on the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of September 11. (St. John's will also be participating in an interfaith service of remembrance at 6pm at Temple Israel—see opposite column for more information.) Children's Sunday School begins, and the Lay Ministry Fair (see below) takes place on September 11.
