A Reading from the book of Genesis:

The same night Jacob got up and took his two wives, his
two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of
the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream,
and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone;
and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the
man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck
him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint
as he wrestled with him. Then he said, "Let me go, for the
day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go,
unless you bless me." So he said to him, "What is your
name?" And he said, "Jacob." Then the man said, "You
shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have
striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed."

righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be
proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to
judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing
and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the
message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or
unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the
utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when
people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having
itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers
to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening
to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always
be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist,

Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion at St. John’s. Approach the altar in a double line in the center aisle. Stand or kneel at the rail and receive the bread in your hand. You may sip the wine directly from the common cup, or you may allow the Eucharistic Minister to dip the bread in the cup and return it to you. If you do not wish to receive the bread or wine for any reason, fold your arms across your chest, and the priest will give you a blessing instead.

If you would like to receive Communion but are unable to walk to the rail, tell a greeter, and a minister will be happy to bring Communion to you at your pew.
