A Reading from the First Book of Samuel

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The
word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he
could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not
yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord,
where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!"
and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you
called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went
and lay down. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and
went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I
did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know
the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him.
The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went
to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived
that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go,
lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your
servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel!
Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his
words fall to the ground. And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew
that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord.

A Reading from the First Book of Samuel

All the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at
Ramah, and said to him, "You are old and your sons do not follow in
your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other
nations." But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a
king to govern us." Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to

Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you;
for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being
king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought
them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other
gods, so also they are doing to you. Now then, listen to their voice;
only—you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the
king who shall reign over them."

So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who
were asking him for a king. He said, "These will be the ways of the
king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them
to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots.
He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle
and donkeys, and put them to his work. He will take one-tenth of
your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry
out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves; but
the Lord will not answer you in that day."

But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said,
"No! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also
may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go
out before us and fight our battles." [1 Samuel 8:4-11, 16-20]

trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will
put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.'
Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward,
saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where
you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I
was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you
have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy
slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather

where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.” *[Matthew 25:14-30]*

Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion at St. John’s. Approach the altar in a double line in the center aisle. Stand or kneel at the rail and receive the bread in your hand. You may sip the wine directly from the common cup, or you may allow the Eucharistic Minister to dip the bread in the cup and return it to you. If you do not wish to receive the bread or wine for any reason, fold your arms across your chest, and the priest will give you a blessing instead.

If you would like to receive Communion but are unable to walk to the rail, tell a greeter, and a minister will be happy to bring Communion to you at your pew.
