PROGRAM INFORMATION





Our mission is to offer a challenging and immersive program of musical study for all children and youth, regardless of means or background, by giving them a chance to sing in an intergenerational setting and in a safe space.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all in grades K-12 who want to sing! All are welcome, regardless of means or background. Membership at St. John's is not a requirement for participation.

HISTORY

The term "Choir School" is used to recall the ancient Christian practice of educating children and youth in music – called the "schola cantorum" or "school of singing."

Though concerned with the study of music, these schools provided a holistic and well-rounded education, characterized by a combination of intense study and practical application.



Vocal Coaching: Choir school students ("choristers") will have access to one-on-one lessons with qualified vocal instructors.

Instrumental Lessons: Choristers will have the option to take piano or organ lessons to augment their choral instruction (limited spaces available). String lessons may also be available through the Bach Parley String Academy at additional cost.

Music Theory: Using the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) standards, choristers will learn music theory with a set of workbooks in group classes.

Solo Opportunities: Choristers will frequently have opportunities for musical solos in the context of concerts and services, building their musicianship and confidence.

Choral Opportunities: The integration of choristers with the St. John's Adult Choir on Sunday mornings will offer them an opportunity to sing a variety of choral repertoire within an intergenerational setting and to exercise their musical leadership.
